Did You Know?

There are free blue recycling bins available to residents of Brenda-Waskada. Pick them up in the Municipal Office during regular office hours. Mon. – Fri. 8:30 AM- 4:30 PM Closed at noon 12:00- 1:00.

If there are recyclable items in your regular garbage bags they may be left on the curb. Please put these recyclable items in your recycling bins.

We are missing 5 plastic flower pots from the Recycling Building. If you know where these could be, please contact the Municipal Office. (204-673-2401)

The Municipality of Brenda-Waskada is involved in the Clean Farms program. You can recycle bale or silage wrap, twine and grain bags. It is free and easy. (see related poster in this issue)

1. Shake to remove debris and keep as clean as possible
2. Roll grain bags and tie securely with twine or use a grain bag roller (where available)
3. Bag your bale or silage wrap and twine. Collection bags are available from the Municipal Office or collection site (Medora Disposal Site)
4. Return to your nearest collection site. Visit cleanfarms.ca to find a site near you. (Medora Disposal Site is our municipal collection depot). Please check elsewhere in this edition for disposal site hours.

RECYCLE EVERY JUG (see related poster in this issue)

Pesticide & Fertilizer Containers (23 L or less)

1. RINSE – Triple or pressure rinse to ensure no product is wasted.
2. REMOVE – Remove caps and booklets to ensure that containers can be recycled. Caps and booklets can be put in your regular garbage.
3. RETURN HERE -Return empty, clean containers to your municipal collection site.

NO CONTAINERS LARGER THAN 23L (return to retailer)

NO OBSOLETE PESTICIDES (hold on farm for next collection event)

Did you know? Not all agriculture plastics are the same. Just like the commodities these plastics host for a time, the plastics can be quite different. To recycle these plastics, each kind of plastic must be sorted and secured.

- 1 Shake to remove debris**
and keep as clean as possible.
- 2 Roll grain bags**
and tie securely with twine or use a grain bag roller
(where available).
- 3 Bag your bale or silage wrap and twine**
Collection bags are available from your RM office or
collection site.
- 4 Return to your nearest collection site**
Visit cleanfarms.ca to find a site near you.

Medora Disposal Site

Only clean, dry and separated plastics (twine, bale or silage wrap
and grain bags) will be accepted.

NOT ACCEPTED:

- no loose materials
- nylon twine
- net/Wrap/Netting
- feed, seed, fertilizer bags

* Large pieces of silage wrap or thick bale wraps may be rolled
or folded tightly similar to grain bags **but must be secured.**

Pesticide & Fertilizer Containers (23L or less)

 - 3 RETURN HERE**
Return empty, clean containers to your municipal collection site.
- No containers larger than 23L (return to retailer).
 - No obsolete pesticides (hold on farm for next collection event).

Seed Treatment Containers

Important Instructions

- 1 Rinse, if possible.
- 2 If rinsing is not possible, close cap securely and place unrinsed jugs together in a separate collection bag.
- 3 When the bag is full, securely close with a tie wrap, rope or knot and take the bag to your local municipal collection site for proper disposal.

The Municipality of Brenda-Waskada reserves the right to refuse containers where instructions for cleaning have not been followed and booklets not removed.

Acceptable Recyclables:

- Aluminum – Beverage Cans, Trays, Pie Plates & other Containers, Foil
- Box Board – Single Layer such as Cereal, Tissue Boxes
- Cardboard – Corrugated
- Glass – Food Jars & Beverage Containers (such as Pop, Wine, Spirit, & Beer Bottles)
- Milk Jugs
- Milk & Juice Cartons/Boxes, Tetra-pak Containers
- Paper – Newspapers, Flyers, Inserts, Junk Mail, Office Paper Materials such as Letter Quality Paper, Envelopes (With or Without Windows), Copier Paper, Computer Printouts, Paper Egg Cartons, Phone Books, Paperback or Hardcover Books, Magazines, Catalogues, Bagged Shredded Paper, Brown Paper Bags, Tissue Roll Cores, Gift and Packing Paper
- Plastics with Recycling Logo #1, 2, 4, 5, & 7 such as Pop & Water Bottles, Laundry Detergent Jugs, Shampoo Bottles, Condiment Bottles, Food Containers such as Yogurt, Margarine, etc.
- Tin Cans – Soup, Ketchup, etc.

Non-acceptable Recyclables:

- #3 – Hard Plastics such as CD Cases or Plastics that Shatter
- #6 – Plastic such as Muffin Containers, Individual Yogurt Containers, etc.
- Bubble Wrap
- Disposable Diapers
- Fluorescent Bulbs (Can be dropped off at Rona)
- Household Hazardous, Bio-hazardous, Chemical Waste/Containers (Accepted at the City of Winkler Public Works Yard – 345 1st St.)
- Light Bulbs
- Medical Waste (Syringes, Bio-Hazardous Material)
- Outdoor Lawn Furniture
- Plastic Bags
- Plasticized, Waxed, or Laminated Material
- Propane or Helium Tanks
- Pyrex or Dishware Glass, Window Glass, Mirrors, Ceramics, Porcelain
- Rubber Tires
- Scrap Metals
- Styrofoam/Styrofoam Packing Material
- Wood Waste (wood products, Christmas trees)

****Please remember that people must handle everything coming from your recycling containers.**

Guidelines:

ALL broken glass should be put into the garbage.

ALL containers should be emptied and thoroughly washed (food residue is a major recycling contamination). Labels do not have to be removed

Please keep the paper dry.

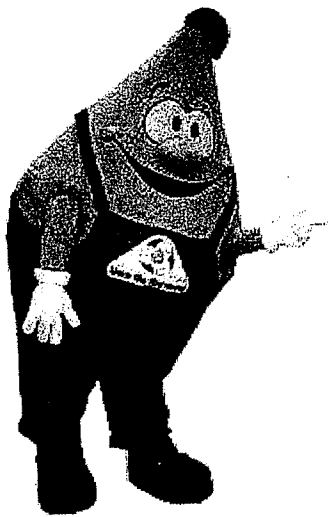

Accepted Products

PAINT

- Deck coatings, floor paints (including elastometrics)
- Single component varnishes and urethanes
- Interior and exterior paints
- Latex, acrylic, or water-based paints
- Alkyd, enamel, or oil-based paints
- Concrete, masonry, drywall, and stucco paints
- Primers and undercoats
- Marine paint**
- Wood, masonry, driveway sealers, and water repellents (non tar-based or bitumen-based)
- Wood preservatives**
- Textured paints
- Melamine, metal and anti-rust paint, stains, and shellac
- Single component swimming pool paint
- Stain blocking paint
- Block fillers
- Empty paint containers
- Wood finishing oils

Maximum container size is 25 L, full or empty

**Unless registered under Pest Control Product Act

PAINT AEROSOLS

All paint aerosols are accepted (consumer, industrial, and automotive)

Maximum container size is 660 g or 24 oz

CORROSIVES

Products that have the corrosive symbol, and is a liquid, aerosol, or solid.

- Rust remover
- Masonry and grout cleaners
- Pool and hot tub cleaners

Maximum container size is 10 L, or 660 g or 24 oz for aerosols.



Commonly used products are listed below. Some collection sites only accept certain products.

FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS & GASOLINE

Flammable liquids and aerosols must display the flammable symbol. Gasoline will be accepted only in an approved ULC gasoline container. For safety reasons, the gasoline container cannot be returned to the consumer at drop off.



- Acetone
- BBQ lighter fluid
- Camping fuel
- Fondue fuel
- Kerosene

Flammable degreasers, lubricants, and liquid adhesives

Flammable fuel treatment and additives

Methanol and methyl hydrate

Mineral spirits

Paint stripper and thinners

Paint and varnish remover

Turpentine and varsol

Other flammable solvents

Leftover, stale, or old gasoline contaminated with oil or water

Maximum container size for flammable liquids is 10 L;

maximum size for aerosols is 660 g or 24 oz. Maximum

container size for gasoline is 25 L.

PESTICIDES & TOXICS

Consumer pesticides and toxics must have the poison symbol (skull and crossbones). Pesticide labels must have the Pest Control Product (PCP) number, and the word "domestic". Toxics must be liquid or aerosol, and include the word "danger".

Liquid, solid pesticides

Automotive additives

Tar and bug remover

Methylene chloride based furniture stripper

Maximum container size for liquid and solid pesticides is 10 L;

maximum size for aerosols is 660 g or 24 oz.

PHYSICALLY HAZARDOUS

(non-refillable fuel gas cylinders)

Products that display both the flammable symbol and explosive symbol.

- Camping fuel, propane or butane cylinders

Maximum container size is 5 kg.



NOT ACCEPTED PRODUCTS

Please note none of the following items are accepted at any location.

- Commercial, industrial, or agricultural products
- Unidentifiable, unknown, or unlabelled products
- Leaking or improperly sealed products
- Non-aerosol automotive or craft paint
- Quick drying or line marking paint
- Paint in glass containers
- Two-part or component paint containing catalyst or activator
- Brushes, rags, and rollers
- Refillable propane containers
- Diesel, or uncompressed propane or butane fuels
- Wine and distilled spirits
- Insect repellents, disinfectants, and pet products
- Caulking compound
- Cosmetic products
- Fertilizer or ammunition
- Drugs and medicines, or medicine sharps
- Mercury switches

THINGS TO KNOW

- Products must be in their original container with label intact, and tightly sealed
- Gasoline must be returned in an approved ULC gasoline container
- Do not mix different types of products together
