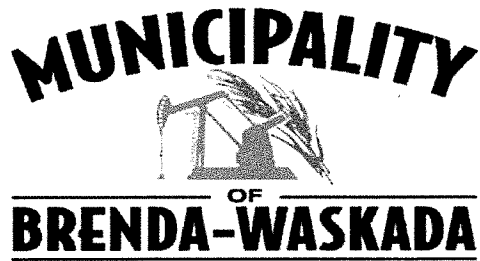

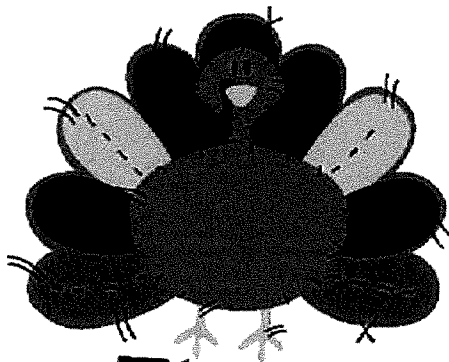

All written/applications must also include legible copies of identification and a declaration of eligibility.

If applying by mail, fax or email, a voter may apply between July 28th and October 21st. A voter applying by mail, fax or email will receive a sealed envelope ballot package by regular post, or by making alternative arrangements with the senior election official.

Waskada Museum

We have enjoyed a relatively successful year at the museum and want to thank all the people who supported us. We had visits from TMSPPA members, a family reunion group, a class reunion group, and a Blacksmith Shop day for a childrens' summer recreation event. There were over 200 visitors in total over the summer!

We received some new items including a complete WWII army uniform, an 1882 Manitoba Free Press newspaper, photos of the Waskada firewagon and first firetruck when they were still in use, cheques and receipts for Waskada businesses (1947-1960), a Mimosa School hand-sewn Union Jack flag, as well as an Arthur School Christmas concert program.

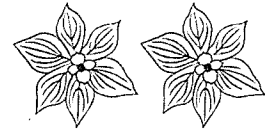
There is always something new to discover at the museum. You are always welcome to explore!

Here are some encouraging comments from past visitors:

1. Comment: just wanted to thank you for the wonderful tour you gave my husband and me.
2. Comment: I visited your museum yesterday. Waskada and area should be proud of the displays this museum offers. It was well beyond my expectations. Made me feel very nostalgic. Great job, everyone!
3. Wayne Boxall and two sisters visited in 2018. Their grandfather belonged to the 222 Battalion (Waskada Division) who trained at Camp Hughes northeast of Brandon. The 1916 picture is on display in the museum. Their grandfather is in the front row. All the soldiers' names are listed. They had never seen this picture before.
After the 1914 spring flood, the 222 Waskada Division was placed on leave to help with the cleanup. All signed their name and rank, etc. on a separate patch of cloth and collected by Mrs. Ren Amos (blacksmith's wife). In the 1950s they were sewn together by Mrs. Harry Mackie, a seamstress. She also ran thread along the signatures to make them stand out. This patchwork quilt is on display in the museum. The grandfather's signature was included. They were thrilled to see it.
They also found their father's and uncle's names in the 1912 Waskada School registers in the Menota School building.
Comment: An incredible journey back in time to see all the treasures in the buildings. It's amazing that Waskada has taken the time and effort to put together all the displays. Bravo to the town and all the contributors!
4. Letter from Hannah Wood, Orreilia Spence's granddaughter.
My partner Jonathan and I wanted to write you - and by extension, those involved with the museum - to let you know how impressed we were with our visit and the curatorial care you've demonstrated. As an historian, I find it thrilling to see such a testament to a community's past, especially when it connects it to the present and renders history a living, breathing thing.

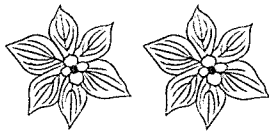

Orange Shirt Day



"September 30th has been declared Orange Shirt Day annually, in recognition of the harm the residential school system did to children's sense of self-esteem and well-being, and as an affirmation of our commitment to ensure that everyone around us matters."

Waskada School has been learning about Orange Shirt Day for a number of years and would like to share with our community what Orange Shirt Day means to us. Each class will have an orange shirt on display at the Village Inn Park on September 29th. These shirts will represent what we have learned and why it is important for us to commemorate this day.

Phyllis (Jack) Webstad's story in her own words...

I went to the Mission for one school year in 1973/1974. I had just turned 6 years old. I lived with my grandmother on the Dog Creek reserve. We never had very much money, but somehow my granny managed to buy me a new outfit to go to the Mission school. I remember going to Robinson's store and picking out a shiny orange shirt. It had string laced up in front, and was so bright and exciting – just like I felt to be going to school!

When I got to the Mission, they stripped me, and took away my clothes, including the orange shirt! I never wore it again. I didn't understand why they wouldn't give it back to me, it was mine! The color orange has always reminded me of that and how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and how I felt like I was worth nothing. All of us little children were crying and no one cared.

I was 13 years old and in grade 8 when my son Jeremy was born. Because my grandmother and mother both attended residential school for 10 years each, I never knew what a parent was supposed to be like. With the help of my aunt, Agness Jack, I was able to raise my son and have him know me as his mother.

I went to a treatment centre for healing when I was 27 and have been on this healing journey since then. I finally get it, that the feeling of worthlessness and insignificance, ingrained in me from my first day at the mission, affected the way I lived my life for many years. Even now, when I know nothing could be further than the truth, I still sometimes feel that I don't matter. Even with all the work I've done!

I am honoured to be able to tell my story so that others may benefit and understand, and maybe other survivors will feel comfortable enough to share their stories.
