



Waskada resident receives Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal

Mr. Norman Reid of Waskada received the distinction of being honored with the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee medal. The award ceremony was held in Brandon on January 17th, 2023. Norm Reid was one of ten recipients from the Turtle Mountain area chosen for this prestigious award. The award continues to honor people who have performed contributory services to their community, province, and the country. This medal was presented to one thousand Manitoba citizens this year. This year marks the last year due to the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Norm Reid was nominated through the Municipal office for his long-standing services to the Waskada Museum. Norm started as a volunteer for the Waskada Museum back in 1998 and has moved up to the role as curator for the Waskada Museum and its artifacts. This position spends countless volunteer hours preserving, researching, cataloguing, applying for grants, hiring, and mentoring a summer student, and displaying the various artifacts and items. He, along with the Museum Board work to maintain the integrity of the six buildings that house the various collections. Norm works with the summer student to provide daily guided tours in the summer months of the various Museum buildings. He is always available to answer any questions or concerns about genealogical or other local historical matters.



MANITOBA GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT FOR BUDGET 2023

Public Invited to Help Shape Provincial Priorities for Upcoming Spring Budget: Friesen

The Manitoba government is inviting Manitobans to join telephone town hall engagement sessions and attend in-person public meetings to help inform Budget 2023, Finance Minister Cameron Friesen announced today.

"As the upcoming budget is prepared, our government remains committed to making life more affordable to Manitobans, while focusing on the creation of local jobs and providing health-care accessible to all," said Friesen. "We're listening to Manitoban families and want to hear from them. To permit as many individuals to contribute as possible, we're inviting all Manitobans to participate in telephone town halls or in-person engagement sessions."

In-person sessions will be held in late January and early February. Community meeting dates include:

- Winnipeg Jan. 30 at 6 p.m. (Winnipeg Convention Centre, Pan Am Room, 375 York Ave.);
- Steinbach Jan. 31 at 6 p.m. (Days Inn Steinbach, 75 PTH 12 North);
- Brandon Feb. 6 at 6 p.m. (Victoria Inn, 3550 Victoria Ave.); and
- Thompson Feb. 9 at 6 p.m. (Best Western Thompson Hotel & Suites, 205 Mystery Lake Rd.)

Regional telephone town halls will be held:

- Winnipeg Feb. 7 at 6 p.m.;
- Rural Feb. 8 at 5 p.m.; and
- North Feb. 8 at 6:30 p.m.

The minister noted participants are asked to pre-register and reserve a spot for an in-person meeting or sign up to receive a phone call for the telephone town hall at https://engagemb.ca/budget-2023.

Ottawa (Ontario), January 6, 2023 – Today, the Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, Karina Gould, together with the Canadian Red Cross, Community Foundations of Canada, and United Way Centraide Canada, announced that the application process for the Community Services Recovery Fund is now open. The application process is managed by these National Funders in order to reach a broad and diverse range of community service organizations, such as charities, non-profits and Indigenous governing bodies.

The Community Services Recovery Fund is a historic one-time investment of \$400 million that will help community service organizations to adapt, to modernize and to be better equipped to improve the efficacy, accessibility and sustainability of the community services that they provide, so they can continue to support communities across Canada through the pandemic recovery and beyond.

Community service organizations are at the forefront of addressing communities' needs, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. Since the early phases of the pandemic, they have struggled with increased demand for their services, reduced revenues, declines in charitable giving due to the rising cost of living, and a greater need to make use of digital tools. Many of them are struggling to recover and adapt their services to the changing needs of communities across Canada.

Applications for funding can be submitted to the National Funders from now until February 21, 2023. Organizations are encouraged to complete the interactive quiz to determine where and how to apply. Additional information and resources, including an applicant guide, can be found on the Community Services Recovery Fund website. The National Funders are also holding a webinar on January 12, 2023, to help organizations understand the application process.







The S.O.S. movies are held every other Tuesday at the Deloraine Theater at 1:30. There is a \$5.00 fee to cover the costs.




Women and men can have different types of heart disease.

Common types of heart disease:

- · Cholesterol build-up in heart blood vessels (coronary artery disease)
- Leaky or stiff heart valves affecting blood flow (valvular heart disease)
- Irregular or rapid heartbeat (arrhythmia)

Women are more likely to have:

- (spontaneous coronary artery dissection, Tear in large blood vessels of the heart
- the heart, limiting blood flow (coronary Tightening of the large blood vessels of vasospasm)
- Small vessel disease (microvascular dysfunction)
- Weakened heart due to a stressful event (Takotsubo cardiomyopathy)
- Weakened heart during or after pregnancy (peripartum cardiomyopathy)
