Re: Manitoba Hydro's 100 Meter Emergency Planning Zone

Dear Landowner/Neighbour

We would like to remind landowners, renters and homeowners that appropriate care and caution is required when conducting any excavation work within "Manitoba Hydro's 100 metre Emergency Planning Zone", which runs along either side of our high-pressure natural gas pipelines throughout the province.

Please remember that if you or a contractor plans to excavate in the vicinity of the pipeline that you must receive a utility clearance from Manitoba Hydro so that we can mark the location of our pipeline prior to the excavation starting, free of charge. Requests for utility clearances can be made to <u>Click Before You Dig</u> Manitoba at;

Manitoba Workplace Safety & Health Regulation 217/2006 and the Gas Pipeline Act, Regulation 140/92 requires anyone disturbing the soil to call for utility clearances prior to starting any construction activity. This applies to any projects you may have that involves a ground disturbance including, but not limited to:

Fencing
Ploughing / trenching
Drilling holes
Grading (land drainage)
Use of any explosives
Crossing with heavy equipment
Any construction within 30 metres of the Manitoba Hydro's Pipeline

Manitoba Hydro's high-pressure natural gas pipelines are made of steel with a plastic coating to prevent corrosion. To ensure the long-term integrity of the pipeline, please contact us if any damage occurs, major or minor, to the pipeline or its coating so we may inspect and ensure proper repairs are done.

Who:

Who is involved? Who is/are the victim(s) and/or suspect(s)?

Provide their full name, nicknames and/or other names they go by

Provide their description: age, race, height, weight, hair (length, style, colour), eye (colour, do they wear glasses/contacts), and any scars, marks, or tattoos

Provide their job or school information

What:

 What type of crime are you reporting? (Please provide details)

What did the suspect(s) do?

When:

When did the crime occur? (Exact date or approximate date and time)

Provide how long the crime occurred for or how long it has been going on for.



Where:

Where did the crime happen?

•Where does the suspect(s) live? (City, nearest cross streets, and address. Provide a description of the location, etc)

Why:

Why did the crime happen? (Was there a reason for it to happen on a certain date and/or time?)

How:

How did the crime happen? (For example if it is a drug crime, how does the dealer sell drugs).

How are you aware of the crime? (Did you see it happen, overhear someone talking about it, etc.)

How many people know about the crime? How did you know to contact Crime Stoppers? (Social media, website, etc.)


EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT IN MANITOBA

Message from Johanu Botha, ADM, Manitoba EMO

As another busy summer season arrives, this is a great time to reflect on how the quality of our hazard response depends on effective preparedness. All of us in the EM world live by the phrases of 'failing to plan is planning to fail' and 'hope for the best but prepare for the worst', and the last few months have been no exception. We've all collaborated on multiple forums to establish our readiness for whatever the next few months might throw at us. I want to thank all the amazing people and organizations that make Manitoba emergency management successful by doing the detailed work that effective preparedness entails. Emergency plans have been reviewed, communication processes have been developed, response activation thresholds have been confirmed, request for assistance processes have been set, and so much more. And as no amount of preparedness can perfectly anticipate how an emergency or disaster might unfold, I also want to acknowledge the remarkable flexibility all of you demonstrate as we respond to events. Another common phrase in EM is of course 'pay attention as the rules are about to change!'

We at Manitoba EMO wish everyone a safe summer: hopefully, we do not have to use any of our emergency plans, but we'll be ready if the need arises.

Are You Prepared?

With emergency preparedness week around the corner, Manitobans are reminded to always be prepared for an emergency. Know the risks or hazards around you and always have an emergency plan in place and an emergency kit ready to go.

One other piece that will greatly assist you in an emergency that isn't often talked about is documentation.

All documentation should be in both digital and paper format. It's a good idea to have your paper copies in a zippered binder that's easily accessible.

Below is a recommended list of what documentation you should have physically and/or digitally to make sure you are prepared for an emergency:

- Photos of your family members and pets. If you're separated from a family member or pet, it's much easier to describe them to people that can assist you if have a recent picture. Try to have both individual and family photos if possible.
- Emergency contact information. Most of us don't know the phone numbers of our closest family and friends without looking at our phones. In an emergency, you may not have your phone, or your battery may deplete. Create a list that includes your contacts' information and how they're connected to you. Also include any work connections, daycare, school, childrens' friends, and any regular service providers (i.e. homecare, food delivery) that may attempt to reach you or enter your home.
- Certificates and ID. Include copies of passports, birth certificates, marriage certificates, religious documents, school graduation certificates (Diplomas or Degrees), and government issued photo identification (drivers licence).

- A copy of every card in your wallet. Copy both the front and the back of every card to make sure you also have contact information if you need to report your card as lost, stolen or destroyed.
- Insurance. Think home insurance, car
 insurance, property insurance, tenants
 insurance, life insurance, long term disability
 insurance, and pet insurance. If you've been
 forced to leave your home, you'll want to know
 what type of coverage you have. The name of
 your insurer, policy numbers and contact
 information can be found on your insurance
 summary sheets.
- Bank and investment account information.
 Take a copy of your monthly statement that has your account number, name, address and other important information.
- Medical information. Medical health cards and medical insurance cards are a must. Also include lists of any allergies or medications for family members, health care directives, and contact information for health care providers.
- Passwords and user names. How many subscriptions do you hold and what are the chances you remember your user names and passwords? It's a good idea to have a list of all of the names of the organizations, user names and passwords in one secure location. Consider updating it often.

In an emergency situation you are already under significant stress. Do yourself a favour and create that binder and electronic file of important documents. Hopefully, you'll never need to use it, but in the event that you do, you'll be grateful.






