In October of 2024, the Waskada Wee Ones Daycare continued a tradition of hosting a steak fry fundraiser evening at the Waskada Rec. Centre. Following the steak supper, Peter Downey graciously volunteered his time auctioning off all 32 NHL teams as well as all 6 PWHL teams. For the NHL auction, successful winning bids ranged from \$250 (Chicago Blackhawks + St. Louis Blues) all the way up to \$1,500 (Winnipeg Jets). When all of the 32 teams had been auctioned off, the total brought in from the bidding amounted to another all-time record of \$18,625 which eclipsed the previous year by exactly \$400. Half of that \$18,625 went directly to the daycare which amounts to \$9,313. The other half went towards 5 separate payouts which were the following: Last Place (15%), 27th Place (15%), Top Canadian Team, Presidents Trophy winner (15%) for top team in the regular season, and of course the Stanley Cup Winner (40%). Top Canadian team (\$1,397) was decided fairly early as the Winnipeg Jets, owned by the Over The Hill Club, won by 8 points over the Toronto Maple Leafs. The Winnipeg Jets and the Over The Hill Club also took home the Presidents Trophy (\$1,397). Last place (\$1,397) was captured for a second consecutive season by the San Jose Sharks who were purchased for \$400. Bill Dickinson won this payout for a 2nd consecutive season, bringing on Tim Hutchins as a co-owner this time around. San Jose had the least amount of points by a 9 point margin over Chicago, which was also owned by the Hutchins/Dickinson owner duo. 27th place payout came down to the last game of the regular season and involved 3 teams which all tied with 76 points. However, Seattle Kraken (Golden Knight Excavating) won the tie-breaker having 2 more regulation time wins than the Boston Bruins & Philadelphia Flyers. The playoffs were exciting as they always are. The Edmonton Oilers (Spence, Radcliffe, and Hannah) and Florida Panthers (Jeff Thom) met for a second consecutive season in the Stanley Cup Finals. After a hard fought 6 game series, the Florida Panthers repeated as Stanley Cup Champions. This top payout of \$3,725 was awarded to Jeff Thom. Congrats to all of the payout winners!

It was decided that we would expand the existing NHL auction evening with another league - the PWHL (Professional Women's Hockey League). That decision allowed us to raise an additional \$1,325 in funds for the daycare. The PWHL was setup as 3 payouts which were the following: 1st place in regular season, last place in regular season, and Championship winner. 1st in the regular season payout (30% - \$398) went to the Montreal Victoire who were owned by Dave Stewart & Tom Bennie. The last place payout (20% - \$265) went to the New York Sirens who were owned by Katie Thom. Lastly, the league champion payout of \$663 (50%) was awarded to the Minnesota Frost who were owned by the Over The Hill Club. Minnesota Frost, like the Florida Panthers, repeat as league champions. Congrats to all of the payout winners!

Plans are underway for the Waskada Wee Ones daycare to host another steak fry and auction sometime in October. Stay tuned for future updates.

- 3 eggs, separated + Cook, stirring, over medium heat until mixture 1 cup granulated white sugar just comes to a boil. Stir in gelatin until it dissolves
 - + Remove from heat.
 - + Stir in lime peel and food coloring
 - + Cool to room temperature. Chill for about 1 hour or until mixture begins to thicken.
 - + Beat egg whites to soft peaks; gradually beat in remaining sugar until stiff. Fold in gelatin mixture.
 - + Chill until mixture mounds.
 - + Pile into cooled pie shell.
 - + Chill until firm. Garnish with whipped cream.

Butter pecan balls

1 cup butter

2 tsp vanilla 1,3/4 cups all purpose flour

1/3 cup icing or confectioners sugar

1/4 tsp salt

2 cup's finely chopped pecans

3 tbsp cold water

- + In mixer bowl, cream butter until fluffy
- + Add vanilla and beat well.
- + In bowl, combine flour, sugar and salt.
- + Add half to creamed mixture; beat to combine.
- + Stir in remaining flour mixture and beat until blended.
- + Fold in pecans
- + Refrigerate dough for 20 minutes or until firm.
- + Form into 1 inch balls. Place, 1 1/2 inches apart, on lightly buttered baking sheets.
- + Bake in 300°f oven for 30 minutes or until golden
